
The Equal Opportunity Centre MERI Professional and law institute Ensures:

- Short-term programmes to teach disabled people employable skills and to increase public awareness of disability;
- Connecting with organisations and institutions that have similar goals and address related issues;

- To guarantee fairness and equal opportunities to the college community as a whole and promote social inclusion;
- To improve diversity among students, faculty, and staff while simultaneously getting rid of the feeling that discrimination exists;



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- To help create a socially supportive environment for the development of healthy interpersonal relationships between students from marginalised sections and from various social backgrounds;
- To offer information and serve as a counseling/guidance centre for students belonging to the marginalised sections, particularly with regard to academic, financial, and other matters;
- To support the development of friendly interpersonal relationships between educators and students from marginalised groups and those with special needs for interactions in the classroom and extracurricular activities;
- To assist students from marginalised groups in overcoming obstacles resulting from discrimination at any level within the parameters of its mandate;
- To arrange or host conferences, seminars, workshops, symposia, exhibitions, etc. periodically on topics of current interest for educating and culturally empowering students with special needs and members of marginalised groups;
- The Advisory Committee should convene at least once every four months, with decisions and actions taken following the meetings.
