FDP Report on Innovative Studio Techniques for Film and Video Communication from August 4 to 9, 2025

The AICTE (ATAL) sponsored Faculty Development Programme (FDP), organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of MERI College, Janakpuri, from August 4 to 9, 2025, brought together educators from across India for immersive training on "Innovative Studio Techniques in Film and Video Communication." The week-long event blended expert lectures, practical workshops, industrial visits, and reflective activities to strengthen the technical and creative capacities of media faculty.

Dr. Tripathi urged research-led teaching and creative experimentation. Dr. Dilip Kumar (IIMC, Jammu) followed with a session on virtual production, volumetric video, and AI in filmmaking, emphasizing both its efficiency and ethical implications.

Day 2 opened with Mr. Lal Chandra Singh (DD News) on motion capture and animation in journalism and entertainment. He demonstrated how animation recreates inaccessible events, stressing accuracy in news graphics. Dr. Shuchi Yadav (JNU) then explored advanced sound design and Foley editing, showing how layered audio effects enhance narrative immersion and professionalism.

Day 3 Mr. Amarjit Singh, broadcast professional and Channel Head of Pavitra News, conducted a session on Visual Effects (VFX) and compositing tools, with a focus on layering, keying, and creative storytelling. His demonstration showcased how these techniques enhance broadcast production. Prof. (Dr.) K.G. Suresh (India Habitat Centre) stressed academic integrity, storyboarding, and NEP-aligned critical thinking, encouraging purpose-driven research. Post-lunch, veteran journalist.

Day 4 began with Dr. Minal Pareek (Sister Nivedita University) on interactive and immersive media, covering AR/VR integration, real-time rendering, and AI-driven storytelling Prof. Manoj Raghuvanshi delivered an insightful session on drone technology, highlighting its wide-ranging applications across media, agriculture, and defense. He explained how drones are transforming news coverage and film production with dynamic aerial shots.

Day 5 featured **Ms. Namrata Singh (Sansad TV)** delivering a session on practical lighting for film and television, covering techniques, modifiers, and on-set problem-solving. In the afternoon, participants visited the **Press Trust of India (PTI)** to observe newsroom operations, editorial workflows, and fact-checking protocols, gaining first-hand exposure to industry standards in accuracy and credibility.

Day 6 began with Prof. (Dr.) Ritu Aggarwal (MERI) discussing AI and machine learning in film editing, showcasing automation in scene detection, color correction, and audio enhancement, while stressing ethical oversight. Participants then engaged in reflective journaling and MCQ-based assessments to consolidate learning. The valedictory session, graced by MERI leadership, commended the participants' enthusiasm and highlighted the FDP's balance of theoretical insight and practical application.

Over the six days, the FDP provided a rich mix of emerging technologies—AR/VR, AI in editing, motion capture, sound design, VFX, drone operations, lighting, and newsroom practices—integrated with pedagogical strategies. It reinforced the need for educators to adapt to evolving media tools, foster critical and creative thinking, and prepare students for industry demands. The sessions were interactive, industry-aligned, and

The coding club of MERI successfully organised a Cisco Packet Tracer Hands-On Session on 14th November'2025, aimed at providing students with practical exposure to core and intermediate networking concepts. The session offered a simulation-based learning experience where participants engaged in configuring network devices, understanding IP addressing, implementing static routing, DHCP services, and performing subnetting calculations using the Cisco Packet Tracer tool.

The primary objective of the session was to bridge theoretical knowledge with real-time practical implementation. Students learned to design network topologies, analyse packet flow, identify device roles, and troubleshoot configuration issues. The exercises conducted during the session included basic LAN setup, router interface configuration, DHCP pool creation, static routing, and subnetting-based topology design. Throughout the session, participants showed active involvement, enthusiasm, and willingness to learn. They asked relevant queries, practiced commands confidently, and demonstrated improved understanding of networking fundamentals. Students expressed that the hands-on exposure helped strengthen their conceptual clarity and boosted their confidence in working with network devices and command-line interfaces.

The Cisco Packet Tracer Hands-On Session proved to be an insightful and productive initiative, equipping students with essential skills necessary for advanced networking studies and certifications such as CCNA.

The Coding Club successfully organised` an insightful and engaging session titled "NeuroVerse: Exploring the Mind of Machines" on 8th November'2025, at the Management Education and Research Institute, conducted by Tushaar Sir, an experienced Technical Project Manager and Cloud & AI Strategy Consultant with over nine years of industry expertise. The session aimed to make students future-ready by helping them understand Artificial Intelligence (AI), Generative AI (GenAI), and the practical applications that are transforming modern creativity and technology.

The presentation began with an introduction to **The AI Revolution**, explaining the evolution of AI from simple chatbots to advanced multimodal agents capable of generating text, music, images, and more. Tushaar Sir emphasised that AI does not replace human creativity; rather, it amplifies it by acting as a collaborative tool for innovation. He also explained the difference between CPU, GPU, TPU (Tensor Processing Unit), and NPU (Neural Processing Unit), helping students understand the hardware behind modern AI systems.

In the session on **AI Art**, students learned how AI-generated artworks are created through techniques such as **Text-to-Image Generation**, **Style Transfer**, and **Generative Adversarial Networks (GANs)**. Real-world examples, including Jason Allen's AI-generated artwork Théâtre D'opéra Spatial—which won an international art competition—helped students understand how AI is entering mainstream creative industries.

One of the most interactive segments was **Mastering Prompts**, where Tushaar Tulsiyan Sir explained prompt writing as the key skill for communicating effectively with AI. He introduced the four essential components of an effective prompt—**Persona**, **Task**, **Context**, **and Format**—and demonstrated how detailed prompts lead to more accurate and meaningful AI-generated results. Students learned how artistic style, mood, and cultural context can refine creative outputs.

In the topic on **The Rise of AI Agents**, students explored how modern platforms like ChatGPT, Gemini, Copilot, and Vertex AI can be used to build autonomous AI agents capable of performing complex tasks. The session also covered **Secure Your AI Agents**, highlighting important security measures such as watermarking, tokenisation, and Google's SynthID to prevent misuse of AI-generated content.

A highly valuable section, **Tools to Make Student Life Easier**, introduced practical AI tools such as Canva, Notion, ChatGPT, Gemini Pro, Zapier, and n8n. These tools assist with assignments, creativity, productivity, and organisation. The demonstration of **Ghibli Art Studio** showcased how AI can recreate iconic Studio Ghibli-style animation, blending technology with artistic imagination.

Tushaar Sir encouraged students to embrace AI confidently, practice consistently, and use it responsibly to enhance creativity, efficiency, and innovation.

The session proved to be highly informative, motivating, and beneficial for students, preparing them to confidently navigate the rapidly evolving AI-driven world.



Report on AI & ML Internship

A six-week Summer internship Program in Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning was conducted from 5 July to 23 August 2025 for undergraduate students. The program aimed to provide foundational and practical exposure to AI/ML concepts, tools, and real-world applications. A total of 39 students participated and successfully completed all requirements.

The program followed a structured daily schedule:

Morning: Theory sessions covering AI/ML concepts.

Afternoon: Hands-on practical labs and coding exercises.

Tools: Python, Google Colab, NumPy, Pandas, Matplotlib, Seaborn, Scikit-learn, NLTK.

Week 1 – Foundations: Introduction to AI, Python basics, and NumPy for numerical computing.

Week 2 – Statistics & AI Search: Advanced statistics (Confusion Matrix, Z-score) and problem-solving using Water Jug, N-Queen, and A* algorithms.

Week 3 – Data Visualization: EDA and visualization with Matplotlib & Seaborn. Mini-project: Customer Churn Prediction using Random Forest.

Week 4 – NLP & Data Wrangling: Text processing with NLTK/SpaCy and data manipulation with Pandas. Mini-project: House Price Prediction using Linear Regression.



The event opened with addresses by Prof. Lalit Aggarwal and Shri I. P. Aggarwal, who emphasized the strategic relevance of Indo–East Asia relations and MERI's role in promoting academic diplomacy. Prof. (Dr.) Ramakant Dwivedi provided the thematic context, highlighting geopolitical shifts, economic interdependence, and the need for policy innovation. Ambassador Skand R. Tayal and Ambassador Ashok Kumar Sharma enriched the discussion with diplomatic insights on Korea, Central Asia, technological partnerships, economic diplomacy, and India's emergence as a major Asian power. The Dialogue was further shaped by contributions from senior journalist Mr. Bhuyan, who examined media's impact on foreign policy narratives and geopolitical understanding.

The technical sessions featured scholarly analyses on India's bilateral relations with major East Asian countries. Prof. M. Badrul Alam presented the historical and contemporary evolution of India–Japan relations, discussing diplomatic realignments, technological cooperation, nuclear agreements, and Japan's proactive global role. Prof. Srikanth Kondapalli addressed India–China relations, analysing military tensions, border disputes, trade asymmetry, China's demographic and economic rise, and the need for diplomatic recalibration. Prof. Jitendra Uttam elaborated on India–Korea relations, identifying opportunities in technology, automotive sectors, multilateral platforms such as G20, BRICS, ASEAN, and India's strategic responses to China's Belt and Road Initiative through the Asia–Africa Growth Corridor. The Dialogue concluded with an interactive Q&A led by Prof. Sadanand Pandey and Dr. S. S. Mishra, synthesizing perspectives on trade, connectivity, geopolitics, strategic partnerships, and India's expanding role in shaping the future of East Asia.

Beyond the core thematic discussions, the MERI Dialogue 5.0 also underscored the significance of economic connectivity, trade corridors, and geo-strategic cooperation between India, East Asia, and Central Asia. Speakers highlighted that India's partnerships with countries such as Japan, China, and the Republic of Korea cannot be viewed in isolation; rather, they intersect with broader regional dynamics involving Central Asian states like Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan. The Dialogue emphasized how these nations—rich in natural resources and strategically located—offer India critical avenues for collaboration in energy, infrastructure, and regional connectivity. The speakers collectively reinforced that

economic ties in an interconnected world depend on three pillars: trade and commerce, energy linkages, and physical connectivity, all of which shape geopolitical stability and shared development. These insights demonstrated that India's East Asia engagement is deeply intertwined with its aspirations in Central Asia, creating an extended arc of strategic influence stretching across the Asian continent. The concluding reflections of the Dialogue highlighted India's pressing need to strengthen multilateral participation and people-to-people exchanges. Recommendations emphasized enhancing cultural, academic, and technological collaborations with East Asian nations, along with diversifying India's trade portfolio and reducing dependencies to correct structural trade imbalances. Experts collectively called for advancing initiatives like the Asia-Africa Growth Corridor to counterbalance China's Belt and Road Initiative, while also encouraging responsible journalism to ensure accurate global representation of India's diplomatic efforts. The Dialogue closed with remarks pointing toward future directions—encouraging India to deepen cooperation through platforms such as G20, BRICS, QUAD, and ASEAN, and to leverage historical civilizational linkages to reinforce contemporary diplomatic strategies. The event's synthesis, articulated by Prof. (Dr.) Ramakant Dwivedi, reaffirmed MERI's vision to cultivate informed debate, strategic awareness, and global citizenship among scholars, policymakers, and students.



MERI DIALOGUE 4.0 "International Conference on "India's Relations with Central & South-East Asia: Challenges & Opportunities"

The conference on "India's Relations with Central and Southeast Asia: Challenges and Opportunities" was held on November 8, 2024, at the Management Education Research Institute (MERI) in Janakpuri, Delhi. Prof. (Dr.) Ramakant Dwivedi, Head of the Centre for International Studies at MERI and director, India Central Asia Foundation, New Delhi, emphasized that the conference aimed to identify opportunities and challenges in advancing India's interests in Central and Southeast Asia. Book Launch was organized by Literary Club members as Dr. Shikha Gupta (Associate Professor), Dr. Simranjeet Kaur (Assistant Professor), and Ms Sarita Yadav (Assistant professor). Prof. (Dr.) Ramakant Dwivedi highlighted the official release of the book India-Uzbekistan: Perspectives on Connectivity between South and Central Asia, underscoring India's economic and political diplomacy in fostering mutually beneficial outcomes for all stakeholders. Prof. (Dr.) Deepshikha Kalra, Dean of the Management Education Research Institute, concluded the inaugural session by emphasizing the need for sustained dialogue and collaboration.

First session of the conference, titled "Economic Ties: Energy, Trade & Commerce, and Connectivity", was chaired by Ambassador Ashok Kumar Sharma, former Indian Ambassador to Kazakhstan. Dr. Yukti Sharma, Specialist on Disability Models (CIE, University of Delhi)

The event commenced with a symbolic candle-lighting ceremony, led by Prof (Dr) Shalini Garg, Dr. kamal pathak, and dignitaries, including **Ms. Vaishnavi Ganesh**, **Mr. Fahad Lambate**, and **Dr. Hemlata**, symbolizing the continuous flame of inclusivity.

Key Discussions:

Understanding Disability: Ms. Vaishnavi Ganesh stressed that disabilities are often not inherent but are created by societal barriers such as physical, informational, and attitudinal obstacles. She pointed out that while 18% of persons with disabilities are born with impairments, less than 24% of these impairments are visibly noticeable.

Employment and Inclusion Challenges: Ms. Vaishnavi also highlighted the concerning statistics of employment for persons with disabilities (PWDs), noting that only 1% of government jobs and a mere 0.1% of private sector jobs are occupied by PWDs. Additionally, only 4% of businesses actively engage in welcoming PWDs into their workforce.

Digital Accessibility: Mr. Fawaad Lambate discussed how accessible digital environments can be created by adhering to the **POUR** principles:

Perceivable

Operable

Understandable

Robust

He outlined a four-step approach – **Educate, Plan, Implement, and Monitor** – to achieve successful digital inclusion for all, not just those with disabilities.

Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPWD) Act: The seminar emphasized the RPWD Act's shift from a

welfare-based model to a rights-based model, urging organizations to develop Equal Opportunity Policies

(EOP) and make reasonable accommodations, such as assistive devices and flexible environments, tailored to

individual needs.

Models of Disability: Dr. Yukti Sharma discussed the shift from the Medical Model, which focuses on

"fixing" individuals, to the Social Model, which seeks to remove societal barriers. She explained how the

National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 promotes inclusion by encouraging schools and institutions to

accommodate the diverse needs of students.

Universal Design for Learning (UDL): Dr. Hemlata presented a case study on inclusive education at DPS,

promoting the Universal Design for Learning (UDL) framework. This approach encourages flexible learning

practices that support all students, including those with autism.

titled "Advancing Disability Inclusion Practices: Communication, Accessibility, and Legislation." The course,



The "Credibility Challenges in Media" workshop aimed to engage students in a critical discussion surrounding the complexities of media credibility in today's rapidly evolving media landscape. This interactive workshop provided a platform to explore the growing concerns about misinformation, the role of social media, and the consequences of biased or unreliable reporting. The session was designed to help students develop a nuanced understanding of how credibility is established, challenged, and maintained in both traditional and new media. The workshop was divided into three main segments:

The session began with a discussion on the importance of credibility in media and the trust consumers place in news sources. Key concepts such as "fake news," "misinformation," and "disinformation" were introduced, with real-world examples highlighting the prevalence of credibility challenges in media today. The session also explored the role of journalistic standards and fact-checking in maintaining public trust. Social media platforms were identified as both a blessing and a curse for modern journalism. While these platforms democratize the dissemination of information, they also create challenges in verifying the truthfulness of content. Students engaged in discussions about the algorithms that prioritize sensational or misleading headlines and how this contributes to the spread of unverified news. Case studies, such as the impact of viral misinformation in recent global events, were examined to demonstrate the dangers of unchecked information in online spaces.

In this practical section, students were introduced to several tools and methodologies for evaluating the credibility of online news sources. These included cross-referencing multiple reliable sources, checking the credentials of authors and organizations, and identifying potential biases in reporting. The use of fact-checking websites such as Snopes, FactCheck.org, and others was discussed. Students were also taught how to apply critical thinking strategies to assess the motivations behind a story and its sources. Total 88 students participated

The workshop provided an invaluable opportunity for students to engage with one of the most pressing issues in contemporary media studies. With misinformation becoming a widespread issue across digital platforms, students left the session better equipped to navigate media landscapes critically and responsibly.



One team member's job was tossing a rubber onto each part of the rectangle created on the floor which held numbered chits.

In the meantime, the second team member was placed next to the Chalk Maze, who would move its piece according to the number that was shown on the chit. The participants must choose a chit corresponding to the number they land on and answer the question written on it. The time limit of answering was 30 seconds.

Every round included two teams competing against one another in five rounds per team which makes ten rounds in total. Subsequently, the next two pairs of two teams then do the same. The winning team moves on with the next round. The three winning team went for another three rounds alternatively.

The point was given when the answer to the question was correct. The team with the most points won the competition. The questions covered a wide range of topics including HTML, JavaScript, C, C++ and Java ensuring a comprehensive test of participants knowledge.

In recent years there has been surge of a cademic interest and publications in the area of third partylogistics (3PL). This can be partly explained by the growing trend of outsourcing logistics activities in a wide variety of industrial sectors.

The continuing wave of consolidation within the 3PL industry has also resulted in the emergence of of large companies that have the capabilities to offer sophisticated logistics solutions on a continental or even global scale. Such logistics service providers (LSPs) strive to assume a more strategic role within the supply chain of clients, expanding their scale and scope of operations. Despite the growing interest in 3PL, the literature on this area appears to be disjointed. Based on an extensive literature review (116 references), this present lecture aims to offer a taxonomy of 3PL studies and point out opportunities for further research. For the sake of rigour, the present speech concentrates only on refereed journal papers published during 1960-2021. Various methodologies have been suggested for future research directions.

WithcontinuouschangeintheglobalanddomesticmarketsforTPLservices, it becomes imperative that both users and providers of TPL services equip themselves with the best in terms of strategy, processes and technology. One of the ways this can be achieved is to bridge the gap between what the industry wants and what research provides. This speech conducts a systematic literature review of research output on TPL vis-à-vis how the TPL industry views the challenges faced bv it in services. The speechidentifies that future research should focus on driving innovation particularly within the last mile by utilizingrouteoptimization, incentivized scheduling, and real-time electronic tracking and communication. It should also focus on how to leverage employees and provide added value to shippers. Supply chain transformation through improved logistics optimization and improved integration across the supply chain is also another important avenue to pursue in future.

In total, 314 students have participated in the national seminar (MBA= 158 students, BBA= 66 students,


MERI CET= 21 Students and other colleges= 69 students). 5 faculty members and 3 research scholars from different colleges and universities have also registered for the national seminar.

The term 'big data' always refer to quantitative data which can be easily expressed as numbers or categories. Statistical and machine learning techniques "love" numbers. On the other hand Qualitative researchers believe that numbers won't always work to draw inferences. They believe that by interviewing people and asking them to answer open-ended questions one can learn more than by simply looking at hard data. Moreover, data mining is the process of extracting hidden patterns from data. Data mining uses machine learning algorithms, to classify, predict, group, recommend, etc. So, the knowledge of qualitative research methods, case study and machine learning software operation would enhance the user skill which in turn can be used in class room teaching and academic research supervision, writing Ph.D and M.Phil dissertations. Keeping this in view, our institute organized a Faculty Development Program on "Qualitative Research Methods and Machine Learning" from 9th - 14th July 2018.

The aim of one week FDP is to understand right approach towards research design, methods and understanding of research epistemologies driving qualitative research methods. 


